
FOUR JUDGES RETIRE



Cleveland: Four Cuyahoga County Common Pleas Court General Division Judges are retiring in early January with more than 100 years of combined community service.

Judge Janet R. Burnside, Judge Carolyn B. Friedland, Judge Stuart A. Friedman and Judge Michael E. Jackson were unable to seek re-election because Ohio law does not allow Judges to run for office after the age of 70.

Judge Burnside has been on the Bench since 1991, Judge Friedland since 1989, Judge Friedman since 1987 and Judge Jackson since 2013.
