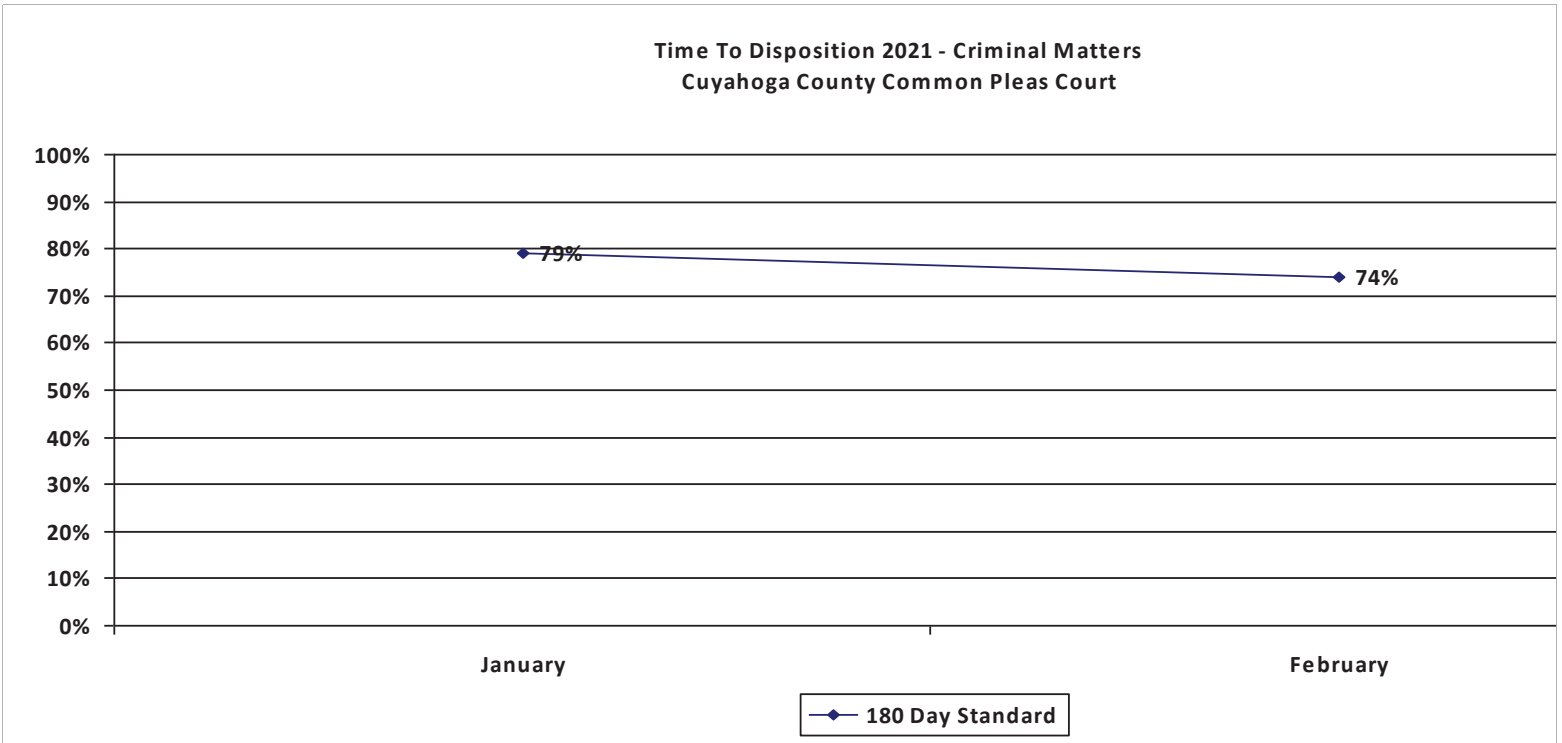


*Time to Disposition

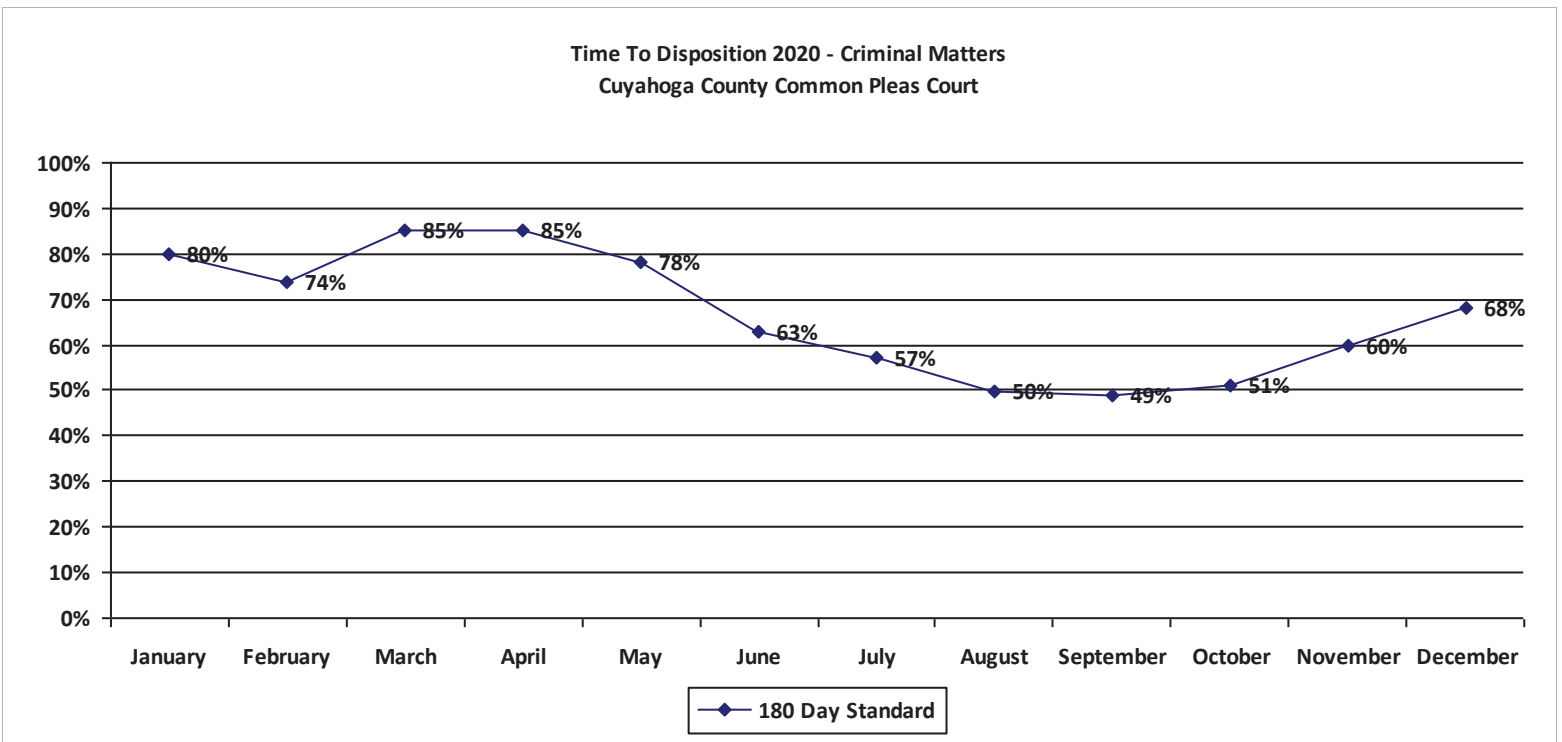
Time to Disposition is used in conjunction with Measure 2 Clearance Rates and Measure 4 Age of Active Pending Caseload, is a fundamental management tool that assesses the length of time it takes a court to process cases. It compares a court's performance with local, state, or national guidelines for timely case processing. When the underlying data conform to the State Court Guide to Statistical Reporting, the measure takes into account periods of inactivity beyond the court control (e.g., absconded defendants, cases suspended pending decision on an appeal) and provides a framework for meaningful measurement across all case types.

The following Time to Disposition charts are based on the Ohio Supreme Court time standards for criminal cases:

Current Time Standard - 100% of all criminal cases disposed within 180 days from judge assignment



2021 Averages: 180 Day Standard: 76% YTD Through February



2020 Averages: 180 Day Standard: 67%
