



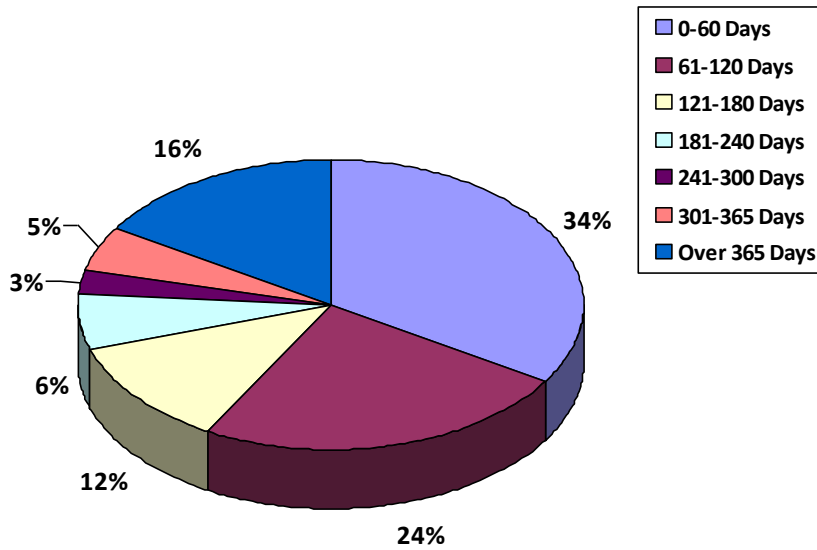
For this measure only active pending cases are included in the analysis. An active pending case is one that is currently moving through the system toward final disposition and is not currently experiencing a period of inactivity such as bankruptcy proceedings on civil cases or where a defendant is unavailable for trial or sentencing on criminal cases due to *capias* or mental health treatment. For cases that have experienced a period of inactivity, the number of inactive days is removed from the age of the case. Additionally, cases that have been placed into programs such as diversion or treatment in lieu of conviction have been removed from the analysis. In the following chart, the total cumulative percentage may not always equal 100% due to rounding.

The Ohio Supreme Court proposed time standards for criminal cases:

75% of all criminal cases disposed within 180 days from judge assignment

95% of all criminal cases disposed within 270 days from judge assignment
